Crossroads of Iowa: recovery programming provided to women in the Polk County Jail or Fresh Start Women's Center to decrease recidivism and improve physical and mental wellbeing

Des Moines Pastoral Counseling Center: subsidized counseling and education for girls and women

Eyes Open Iowa: advocacy, training, and public education to improve adolescent sexual health

FreeStore: providing pre-owned household furnishings to women and families leaving domestic violence or returning to the community from prison

Healthy Birth Day (Count the Kicks): public awareness and resources for pregnant women and medical providers to reduce the chance of stillbirth

House of Mercy: housing and support services for women recovering from substance abuse, trauma, mental illness, and homelessness

Young Women's Resource Center: group and individual programs supporting mental, physical, and behavioral well-being of girls ages 10-21

Al Éxito: culturally relevant programs for Latina students and their families to promote high school graduation and college success
